Parade Day Traffic Alerts

Please take note of the following road closures and parking restrictions to plan ahead and find alternative routes.

There will be **NO PARKING** along the **parade route** and **staging area** from 5 a.m. until the parade concludes.

Parade Participant Parking/Drop-Off:
All parade participants are asked to park or be dropped off at the Palatine Family Aquatic Center parking lot (340 E. Palatine Rd) and walk across to the staging area.

Road Closures & Traffic Info:

Oak Streets, heading west and ending at Durty Nellie's where the after party kicks off at noon! Enjoy Irish fare, live music, dancing, and your favorite Irish beverages.

- Just prior to 9:30 a.m. - N. Oak St. will be closed between E. Palatine Rd and E. Wood St. Access will only be permitted for vehicles or floats in the parade. If you are walking in the parade, please use the designated parking/drop-off location.
- Just prior to 9:30 a.m. - E. Slade St. will be closed to local traffic only between N. Benton & N. Oak St. Parade participants cannot access the staging area via E. Slade St.
- Just prior to 10:30 a.m. - Wood St. will be closed between N. Oak St. and N. Smith St. Additionally, N. Smith St. will be closed between W. Wilson St. and W. Colfax St.
- Roads will reopen once the parade concludes, as determined by Palatine Police.

Luck O' the Irish Won't Save You From a DUI



The Palatine Police Department is teaming up with the Illinois State Police and Illinois Department of Transportation for a stepped-up traffic safety campaign to remind motorists of the dangers of impaired driving and to help keep our streets safe.

In addition to looking for alcohol- and cannabis-impaired drivers, the Police will be stepping up seat belt enforcement, particularly at night when seat belt usage rates are lowest. Speeding, distracted driving and all traffic laws will be strictly enforced.

Whether you're attending a party, hosting friends or going out to a bar, keep safety at the forefront of your day and night. When it's time to leave, make sure your designated driver is sober. Remember that walking impaired can also be dangerous, so designate a sober friend to walk home with you. Designated drivers: Be alert for impaired walkers who may not obey street signs. It's not about luck, it's about smart decisions.

Other important tips:

- Drunk or high, it doesn't matter. It is never okay to drive impaired. Designate a sober driver or plan to use public transportation or a ride service to get home safely.
- If you see an impaired driver on the road, contact law enforcement.
- Have a friend who is about to drive impaired? Take the keys away and plan to get your friend home safely.

- Always buckle up!

The St. Patrick's Day enforcement campaign is funded by federal traffic safety funds from the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration and administered by IDOT.

District 1 and 2 Town Hall/Advisory Meeting March 19





CDBG Community Needs Survey 2025

The Village of Palatine is conducting a survey to gather feedback regarding local housing and community development needs. Your input will shape how Palatine allocates Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funding over the next five years. CDBG federal dollars are allocated to local governments by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to assist housing and community development projects that benefit low and moderate-income residents

The survey asks 11 questions and should take about 10 minutes to complete. Your responses can be completely anonymous. **The survey will be open through March 31, 2025.**

Fire Hydrant Flushing



The Public Works Department Utilities Division will begin its annual hydrant flushing program in late March. This process moves water through the pipelines at a fast rate to clean the lines, clear stagnant water, and identify broken hydrants. Each hydrant is left open for approximately 2 to 3 minutes until the water runs clear. Crews will work in sections and the whole program takes about 3 weeks to

complete, depending on weather.

If broken hydrants are found, they will be marked with plastic rings stating "OUT OF SERVICE" to identify them for the Fire Department. Rest assured that Public Works crews will repair these fire hydrants in the near future.

Early Voting for Consolidated Election Runs March 17 - 31

Early Voting for the April 1, 2025 Consolidated General Election will take place March 17th through March 31st, including weekends, at 150 W. Wilson Street during the following hours:

- Monday thru Saturday: 9 am to 5 pm
- Sunday: 10 am to 4 pm



Voter Registration: Non-registered voters can register to vote and cast their ballot at all early voting sites. Two forms of identification must be presented with one ID showing the voter's current address.

Election Day: Polls are open from 6 am to 7 pm at designated polling places. Non-registered voters can register to vote at their home precinct ([polling place](#)).
