Yard Waste Collection Begins Week of March 31



Curbside bagged yard waste and bundled brush collection resumes the week of March 31, 2025.

Please note the following requirements for yard waste collection:

- All yard waste (grass or shrubbery clippings and leaves) shall be disposed of in two-ply brown paper yard waste bags. No plastic bags, boxes, or containers of any kind are permitted for yard waste disposal. Each paper bag shall not exceed 60 pounds in weight.
- Branches or limbs cannot exceed four inches in diameter and must be bundled not to exceed four feet in length. Bundles shall be secured with biodegradable cotton twine or rope. Bundles must not weigh more than 60 pounds each.
- Please have all yard waste at the curb no later than 6:30 AM on the scheduled collection day.

April is National Safe Digging Month

April marks National Safe Digging Month, reminding homeowners and professional excavators to contact JULIE



before every digging project, regardless of the size or depth. The goal of this initiative is to reduce the risk of striking underground utility lines and potentially causing environmental or property damage, costly delays or personal injury. Putting up a fence, installing a mailbox post, building a deck or patio and planting trees and shrubs are all examples of projects that require a notification to JULIE first, which is a free service.

Member utilities have three business days to respond to your request. So if you want to start your outdoor project on the weekend, contact JULIE on Wednesday to begin digging on Saturday. JULIE's call center agents are available to receive and process requests 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Call 811 anytime to submit your locate request. A free, self-service option called E-Request is also available anytime [online](#).


Striking a buried utility line can cause injury, repair costs, penalties and inconvenient outages. Here are five important steps to follow before putting a shovel in the ground:

1. Pre-mark the dig site with white paint or flags.
2. Go to **JULIEBeforeYouDig.com** or call 811 to submit your locate request.
3. Wait the required amount of time (at least three days).
4. Respect the marks.
5. Dig with care.
