Today the Village of Palatine and the Palatine Park District are celebrating National Arbor Day with the planting of trees.



Police Taking Back Unwanted Prescription Drugs Saturday, April 26

On Saturday, April 26, from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m., the Palatine Police Department and the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) will give the public an opportunity to prevent pill abuse and theft by ridding their homes of potentially dangerous



expired, unused, and unwanted prescription drugs.

2025 Roadway Rehabilitation Improvements Project

CONSTRUCTION ALERT: Michigan Avenue, Brockway Street, Gilbert Road, Louise Lane, and Cornell Avenue will be rehabilitated and resurfaced this year. The Village received \$550,000 in grant funds through the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity (DCEO), which will provide a majority of the funding required to rehabilitate the pavement and improve drainage on Michigan Avenue and Brockway Street. Motor Fuel Tax (MFT) and local funds will be used for the balance of the project.



The project limits are:

1. Michigan Avenue from Cedar Street to Plum Grove Road
2. Brockway Street from Gilbert Road to Illinois Avenue
3. Gilbert Road from Brockway Street to Plum Grove Road
4. Louise Lane from Dundee Road to the dead end
5. Cornell Avenue from Carter Street to Chestnut Street

Work is scheduled to begin the week of April 28, 2025 and is anticipated to be complete by August. The project includes pavement widening and resurfacing, spot full-depth pavement reconstruction, spot sidewalk and curb and gutter replacement, concrete edging installation, sidewalk installation to fill gaps, and sidewalk ramp upgrades to meet ADA requirements.

All of the streets will be accessible throughout the duration of the project, but access will be limited during working hours due to the construction activities.

Illinois Route 53 Improvement Projects

CONSTRUCTION ALERT: The Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) is improving Illinois Route 53 from Algonquin Road to Lake Cook Road. The

work is separated into three projects, but progress will be made on each project simultaneously.

- The first project is to rehabilitate the bridge carrying Euclid Avenue over Route 53 and includes replacing the existing bridge decks, approaches, and expansion joints and drainage improvements.
- The second project consists of rehabilitation of the bridges over Kirchoff Road, Industrial Avenue, Northwest Highway, Palatine Road, and Anderson Drive; culvert repairs at Salt Creek; and retaining wall repairs.
- The third project includes rehabilitation of the bridges over Algonquin Road, Salt Creek, and Rand Road; installation of shared use paths under Route 53 at Rand and Algonquin Roads; and drainage improvements.

Pavement reconstruction and resurfacing, ramp repairs and resurfacing, traffic signal modernization, and lighting improvements throughout the entire corridor from Algonquin Road to Lake Cook Road are also included.

IDOT expects the Euclid Avenue bridge work to be completed in summer 2026 and all other improvements to be completed in late 2026.

Traffic delays are to be expected, including lane closures. At the Euclid Avenue section, Route 53 will be reduced from two lanes to one lane in both directions throughout the duration of the project. Through the other sections, three lanes in both directions will remain open at all times, though lane shifts and occasional overnight closures are to be expected.

Free Trees from MWRD



The Metropolitan Water Reclamation District (MWRD) provides free native tree saplings through their "**Restore the Canopy, Plant a Tree**" program. Native trees can help reduce flooding by soaking up rainwater. Trees also produce oxygen, keep neighborhoods cooler, provide habitat for wildlife, lower energy bills and store carbon dioxide to help address climate change.

Various kinds of native saplings (such as native red, pin, swamp white, bur, and chestnut oak) are available for free to Cook County residents, community groups and schools.

Putting up a fence, installing a mailbox post, building a deck or patio and planting trees and shrubs are all examples of projects that require a notification to JULIE first, which is a free service.
