

Palatine Police Speed Awareness Day Results

Speeding remains one of the leading contributing factors in traffic crashes across the country. In an effort to reduce speed-related injuries and fatalities, the Palatine Police Department proudly participated in Speed Awareness Day (July 23, 2025) a



coordinated campaign supported by the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) and the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA).

Originally established in 2016 by the Illinois Association of Chiefs of Police (IACOP), Speed Awareness Day was created to address the deadly consequences of speeding through a collaborative effort involving both public and private

stakeholders. What began as a statewide initiative in Illinois has since expanded its reach. In 2022, agencies across NHTSA Region 5—including Indiana, Ohio, Michigan, Minnesota, and Wisconsin—joined the effort. By 2023, Region 7 states such as Arkansas, Iowa, Kansas, Missouri, and Nebraska were added, creating a unified approach to traffic safety across much of the Midwest.

The goal of Speed Awareness Day is twofold: to educate the public about the dangers of speeding and to implement high-visibility enforcement to deter unsafe driving behaviors. This year, the Palatine Police Department contributed to these efforts through both community outreach and focused enforcement operations.

As a result of our participation in this campaign, the additional officers issued the following citations (July 23, 2025 only):

- 67 speeding citations
- 18 distracted driving citations
- 4 no insurance citations
- 2 seatbelt citations

The Palatine Police Department remains committed to reducing dangerous driving behaviors and making our roadways safer for all. We thank the community for their continued cooperation and support in these vital traffic safety initiatives.


Community partners and organizations, along with local businesses will also be on hand to support the event and provide valuable information and services to attendees.
