Palatine Police Department to Host First-Ever National Night Out Event August 6, 2025



The Palatine Police Department is proud to announce its first-ever National Night Out, taking place on Wednesday, August 6, 2025, from 5:00 PM to 8:00 PM at the Palatine Park District's Falcon Park, located at 2195 N. Hicks Road.

National Night Out is a nationwide, annual event designed to promote strong community partnerships and enhance the relationship between neighbors and law enforcement. Communities across the country participate in this evening of fun, food, and connection—with a shared goal of making neighborhoods safer and more caring places to live.

This free, family-friendly event will feature:

- Police and fire vehicle displays
- Interactive safety demonstrations
- Giveaways (while supplies last) and kids' activities
- Food vendors and refreshments
- Live music and entertainment
- Community partner booths and resources

“We’re excited to bring National Night Out to Palatine for the very first time,” said Deputy Chief David Brandwein. “It’s a great opportunity to meet the officers who serve our community, strengthen relationships, and celebrate the spirit of public safety together.”

Community partners and organizations, along with local businesses will also be on hand to support the event and provide valuable information and services to attendees.

Parking and entry are free, and the event is open to all Palatine residents and neighboring communities.


