Winter Brush Collection Begins February 2

The Public Works Department will begin its annual winter curbside brush collection on Monday, February 2, 2026. Loose brush must be set out at the curb by 7:00 AM on that day. Please follow these guidelines when preparing your branches:

- Brush must be 8 inches or less in diameter to accommodate the chipper.
- Firewood, tree stumps, and root balls will not be accepted because of the potential to damage the chipper.
- Branches should be as long as possible with cut ends facing the street, without impeding traffic or blocking the sidewalk.
- Clean Christmas trees (without lights or decorations) will be accepted.



Crews will make only one pass down each street. If brush amounts are excessive, it may take all week to finish the collection.

The collection may be delayed due to snow. An announcement will be made if the pickup needs to be rescheduled due to poor weather conditions.


Dangerous Cold



Dangerous Cold Timeline

Timeline of temperatures, wind chills, and wind speeds through the weekend

With the dangerous cold conditions residents are urged to take the following precautions, including dressing warmly, limiting time outdoors, protecting pets, and safeguarding homes by insulating pipes and ensuring heating systems are functioning properly. Use space heaters safely by keeping them at least three feet away from anything that can burn, never leaving them unattended, and ensuring they are in good working condition. Avoid using ovens or grills to heat your home, and make sure smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors are working properly.

In addition, with the unsafe temperatures, Cook County's Department of Emergency Management and Regional Security has an updated list of warming centers for residents to protect themselves and their families.

Extreme Cold Weather Tips

Prepare for the extreme cold weather and snow event in the coming days with these tips to stay safe, comfortable, and reduce your energy expenses:

1. Reduce Thermostat Settings: Consider lowering the temperature on your thermostat below 70 degrees to reduce energy consumption during extreme cold weather events.
2. Selective Space Heating: Use space heaters wisely by focusing on heating rooms where you spend the most time, like the living room or bedroom. This approach maximizes warmth where it matters most.
3. Weather Stripping: Apply weather stripping to windows and doors to seal gaps and keep the winter chill from sneaking into your home. This simple step helps maintain a cozy indoor temperature.
4. Fireplace Damper Management: Close the fireplace damper when not in use to prevent cold air from entering through the chimney, maintaining a warmer indoor



environment, and saving on energy expenses.

5. Open Cabinet Doors: To help prevent pipes from freezing within your home, open cabinet doors to allow space heating to reach the areas below the faucets and sinks in the kitchen, bathrooms, and laundry room especially interior pipes situated within the outside walls of your home.
6. Natural Light Utilization: Take advantage of natural light during the day by opening blinds. Sunlight not only provides extra heat but also allows you to enjoy the winter wonderland outside without relying on artificial lighting.

In addition to these tips above, prioritize safety by clearing snow away from outside utility meters and HVAC vents. This precautionary measure helps prevent potential carbon monoxide poisoning within your home or business. Make these winter tips part of your routine to stay warm and ensure safety during the upcoming winter advisory!
